Pastor's Corner

In the year of Jubilee, we are called to a time of rest or Sabbath for ourselves and for the earth. Jubilee is a year long celebration reminding us of the need for rest in the renewal process. When some portion of each day is given to rest, then each week there will be time to remember and put God first. For Israel, this process was to include one full year in fifty. It was a great do over and the captives (slaves) were to be released and property restored to the rightful owners. There was a rest from the production of the land.

As we continue, in a spiritual year of Jubilee, we want to apply these same principles to our lives. In each principle of a jubilee year (rest, release, and restoration), there is an element of trust. If I give up the help I have acquired, let go of some of the land I have obtained, and do not sow and reap, how will I survive? Better still, what will happen next year as I start over in my physical and economic pursuits? We long to understand the deeper issues of the spiritual life. Yet, we neglect the road map God is showing to us in our known world that allows clearer understanding of the spiritual world.

When we celebrate a year of jubilee "and give life a rest" we do not get farther behind, but in fact quite the opposite. Like pruning fruit trees, we eliminate many buds but the remaining buds produce larger and more fully developed fruit and help to eliminate disease. Without pruning, there would be much less eatable fruit. When we learn to let go, if only once in a life time, we learn a lasting spiritual blessing- God can be trusted. By giving God one seventh of our time in a Sabbath and one tenth of our resources in a tithe, we learn trust and the principle of spiritual increase. Throughout this year, each of us can find ways to implement these spiritual principles as we, the church, learn to celebrate God and grow in our worship. May 2010 be a year of growing in trust as we celebrate a year of jubilee.

Again Your power amazes me, For writing is not my line. But the words are coming easily, I guess Your love must shine.



2. Small Group Leadership - Dr. Gary Campbell



AMAZING.....

Come to ROCCFest, May 15, 2010, to hear the gutwrenching testimony of Brian "Head" Welch.

Here is part of his testimony, used by permission, from the publication Christianity Today.

Ex-Korn guitarist Brian "Head" Welch recounts his self-destructive rise to stardom, and the major changes in his life since praying to God for deliverance.

It was 2004 and Korn's lead guitarist Brian "Head" Welch had hit rock bottom. As a member of the controversial band that became the voice for youth worldwide with lyrics about alienation and abuse, the pressures of the rock star life had torn (him) apart.

The band sang about what it was like to suffer alienation as a kid. (Brian) was picked on a lot at school and he wrote about what it felt like and his thoughts of suicide. He wound up connecting with millions of kids suffering the same thing abuse, molestation, shame, and embarrassment. He was blatantly singing about what had happened to him, venting on his records about his anger and pain. The wealth and fame he once thought would bring him happiness and fulfillment had left him even more miserable and empty, mired in a dark depression. Addicted to methamphetamines and alcohol, the childhood dream of stardom had become a nightmare for the longhaired, bearded, and heavily tattooed musician.

Despite several attempts to free himself from his addiction, nothing not even the birth of his daughter, Jennea, could spur him to quit drugs for good. As the pressures of the business increased, his addictions worsened. His wife, Rebekah, left him in 2000. When she failed to attend the court date concerning Jennea, Welch gained full custody. "Left to raise my daughter by myself I got stressed out and started drinking and partying more.

By 2004, Welch was deeply depressed, suicidal, and addicted, fantasizing what a relief it would be if he overdosed. "My life was crumbling. I needed to get off drugs. I tried a couple of rehabs, but that didn't work."

Then one day he heard his then 5-year-old daughter Jennea singing a Korn song about sex. Welch knew at that point that he had to leave the multiplatinum band and raise his daughter right.

At the end of his rope, Welch prayed and God answered in a big way.

Reaching out to a Christian friend in an e-mail, Welch hinted how unhappy he was. Days later, the friend wrote back, saying Welch came to mind after reading Matthew 11:28 that morning: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." The verse touched something deep inside Welch and a lifetime of pain came pouring out. He told his friend he was a lost soul, and recalled asking Jesus into his heart as a child, remembering a presence of peace and love that had embraced him in his youth "I had been filled with anger, confusion, hate, selfishness, greed, you name it. When God revealed himself to me, it was a supernatural peace and love that was so far higher and beyond anything you can experience on earth," he said. "I knew it was God. I knew it was him revealing heaven to me, eternal life. He poured out his love into my heart, and I was instantly changed in that moment. I mean God became so real to me. He's irresistible."


... After accepting the Lord, Welch got a number of new tattoos, including "Jesus" on the fingers of his right hand and "Matthew 11:28" on his neck.
 "I felt like God was leading me to get more because he wants to use this [my tattoos] as a statement," Welch said. "He saved me and delivered me from drugs and he's showing the world through me as an example how he loves everybody unconditionally both people with tattoos and people without tattoos."

Welch said he hopes his book and music will help inspire others to ask Jesus into their hearts and avoid a similar path of self-destruction. "God is moving," Welch said. "He's doing great things and he loves the prideful rock stars just the way he loves the starving kids in India. He loves us all.

"And he's calling us to be his ministers. He wants us to go and declare his goodness. I just think he's moving and he wants to do something new. He says in the Bible, 'I'm doing a new thing.' And so he's doing a new thing. I'm just glad to be part of it."

Grief Support---April 18 at 5:30 p.m.

As I write this, it's been just one month since my husband, Gary, died. Second time around being a widow ought to be easier, right? But so far, I don't think that's happening. This time seems just as challenging, but in different ways. The grieving process differs for each of us, and I'm learning it can be different within the same individual!

I have a picture of a lava field hanging by my computer. Coming out of the seemingly dead, porous rock is a single, green, fern frond. My hope is to become the fern. But for now I feel like the lava.

Probably if I prayed enough and worked at it enough, I could wade through my sorrow and reorder my life without a "support group" specifically for grief. But why should I endure any extra struggle? I have grown to like the path of least resistance.

So on Sunday, April 18, I will be at our church at 5:30 p.m. in the new conference room next to the sanctuary, meeting with the grief support group that Joyce Thomas leads. We typically meet for an hour and a half on the third Sunday of each month. Group members can either share or listen, and their grief can be about any significant loss, including death. Typically a few good ideas come up each session about overcoming hurdles in our grief walks.

We share, we listen, and we pray. It's a thought-provoking time. If you're laboring over a significant loss in your life, be with us this month, won't you?
